An approach to gun control you will not like, and neither do I

To be clear, I am against violence and I believe that owning and using firearms for legitimate reasons is a reasonable thing. That includes hunting game, suppressing pests on farms, self-defense, and defense of your home. However, the extent of gun violence in the United States has motivated me to make a suggestion that I believe is rational, but I do not actually support.
